START HERE

Your movie night, on paper.

Every movie in here is one you probably loved as a kid. None of them are the gentle, all-clear pick your memory says they are.

This guide walks through each one scene by scene, so nothing catches you off guard from the couch. Keep it next to you, watch the clock, and you will see each moment coming.

It is the paper version of what FilmScout does automatically, synced to your screen, on any movie you search.

How we chose these twelve.

One rule: each film had to be one you would hand a kid without a second thought, and each had to hold a moment your memory quietly edited out.

Not the scariest movies. Not the worst. The **beloved** ones, the ones on every “good for kids” list, with a scene that sneaks up. If a film was only ever known for being intense, it did not make the cut. The surprise is the whole point.

These are the twelve worth watching together, and worth being ready for.

Three flags, one score.

Each movie gets a page of the moments worth knowing about, tagged one of three ways:

HEADS UP

Worth knowing about. A moment to be aware of.

MUTE

Consider muting. Intense enough you may want the sound down.

SKIP

Consider skipping. The heaviest moments in the movie.

Two more colors. The **blue** boxes on each film are talking points, for the conversation after. In the app, a **purple** triggers & phobias layer tunes every score to your own family (see page 12).

About the artwork. The scene art in this guide is our own illustration. In the FilmScout app you get the real movie art and a scene-by-scene timeline that follows your screen in real time.



The ScoutScore

A single number for how much content to expect, shown with this shield beside every movie in this guide.

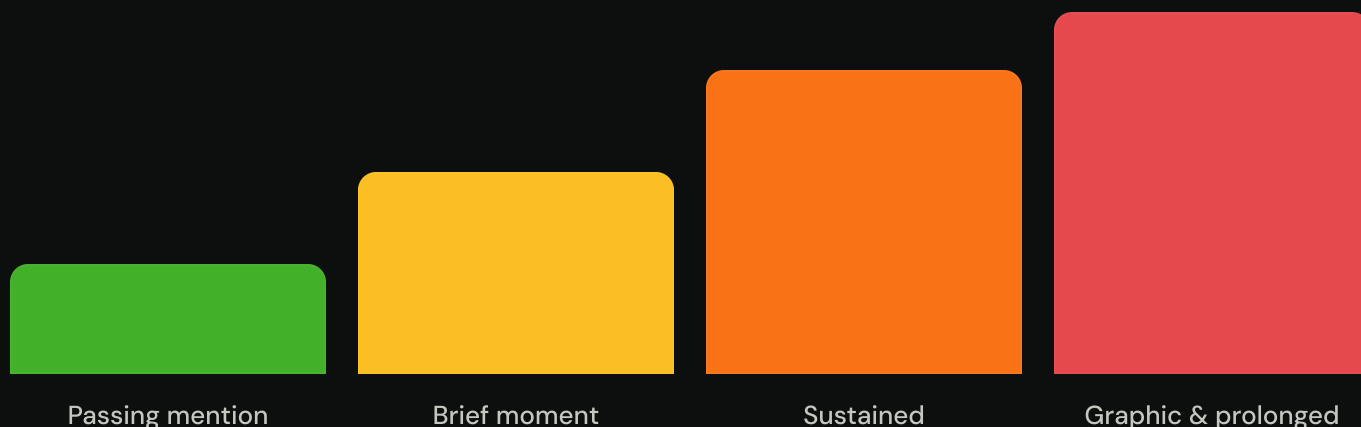


Lower is lighter. Higher means more to be aware of. The scale is open-ended, so there is no maximum.

TAME Under 15	Light or no content flagged. A comfortable pick for most families.
MILD 15 to 49	Worth a quick check. Minor content moments.
BOLD 50 to 84	Heads up before you watch. Notable content.
STRONG 85+	Significant content. Review scenes first.

HOW IT'S SCORED

Intensity is a ladder, not a checklist.



Moving up a rung matters far more than adding another flag at the same level.

Intensity over frequency

A longer, more detailed version of a moment scores higher than a passing mention of the same thing.

The intense moments carry the weight

The score follows a movie's most intense scenes, not how many flags it has. A crowd of mild moments never adds up to one genuinely intense one.

Comedy is dialed down

When a moment is clearly played for laughs, it counts for less. A slapstick punch is not weighed like a real one.

Tuned to your family. In the app, dial each kind of content up or down in your Profile and the ScoutScore adjusts to what matters in your home.

QUICK REFERENCE

Ratings, and how we map to them.

US letter ratings are a blunt tool, and they vary by country. A PG can hide a scene a PG-13 does not. That is why we score by scene, not by letter. Rough guide:

RATING (USA)	WHAT IT MEANS	OFTEN
G	All ages. Nothing most parents would object to.	TAME
PG	Parental guidance suggested. Some material may not suit young kids.	MILD
PG-13	Some material may be inappropriate under 13.	BOLD
R+	Restricted. Intended for older teens and adults.	STRONG

A letter tells you a movie's ceiling. The ScoutScore and the scene list tell you what is actually inside, and when.

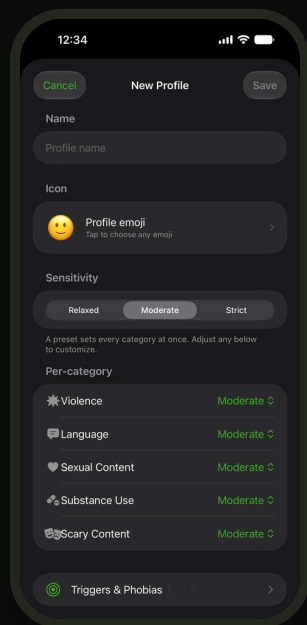
Personalized to your family.

This guide gives every family the same score. The app gives you **yours**.

Set up a profile and turn on the **triggers & phobias** that matter in your home: clowns, vomit, spiders, needles, dogs in peril. Every ScoutScore and scene recalibrates to your family.

A G-rated example

A gentle scene sits at **Tame** for most homes. Switch on the one phobia your child actually has, and the app lifts that same scene to **Mild**, just for you. Same movie, your family's score.



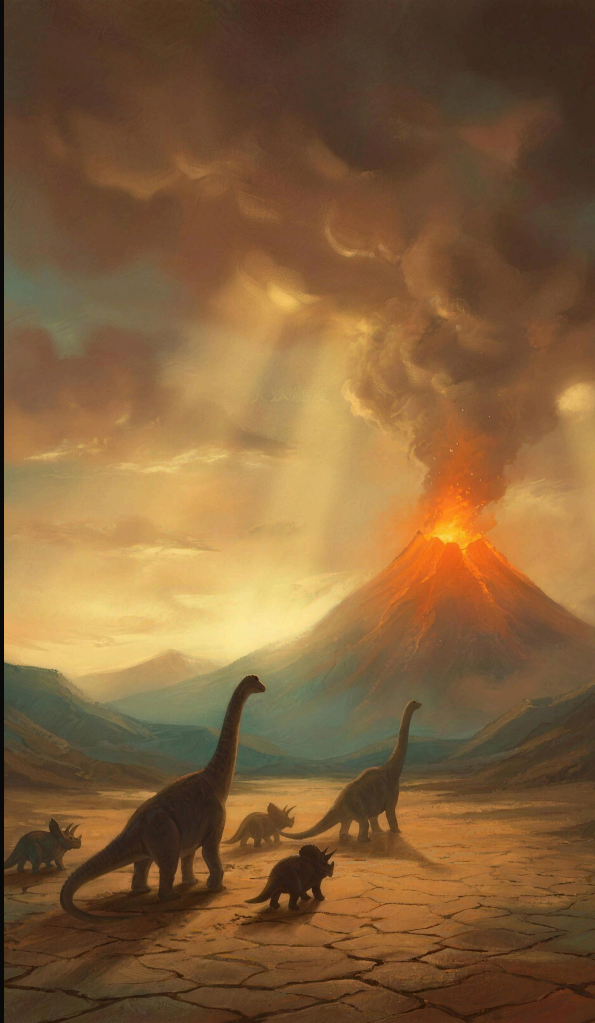
Dial it in

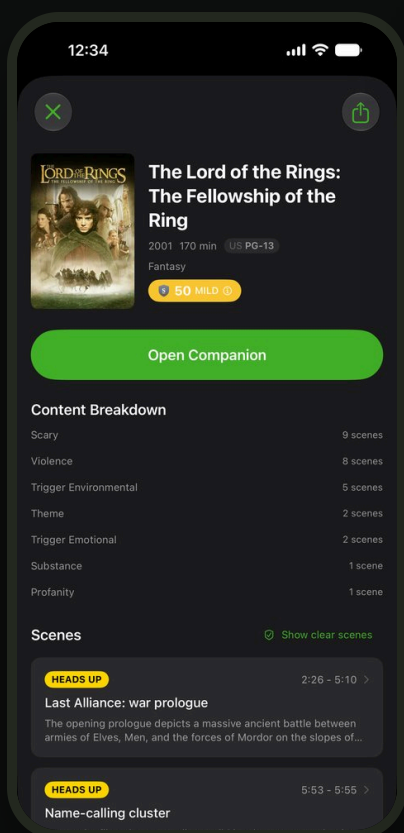

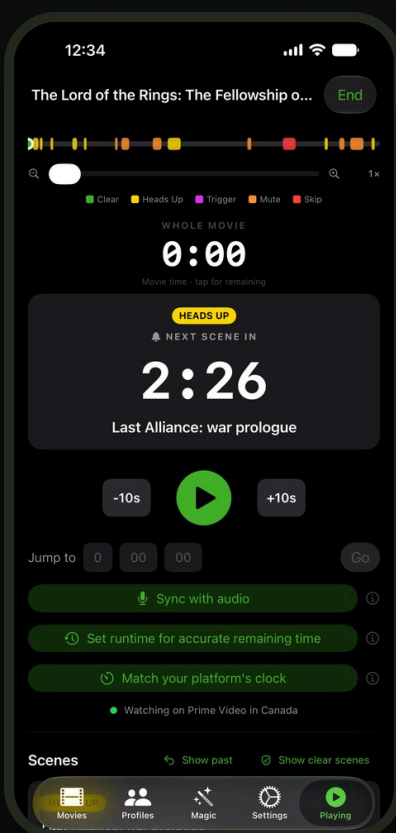
How the app works.

This guide covers twelve movies. The app does the same thing for any movie you search, without watching the clock yourself.



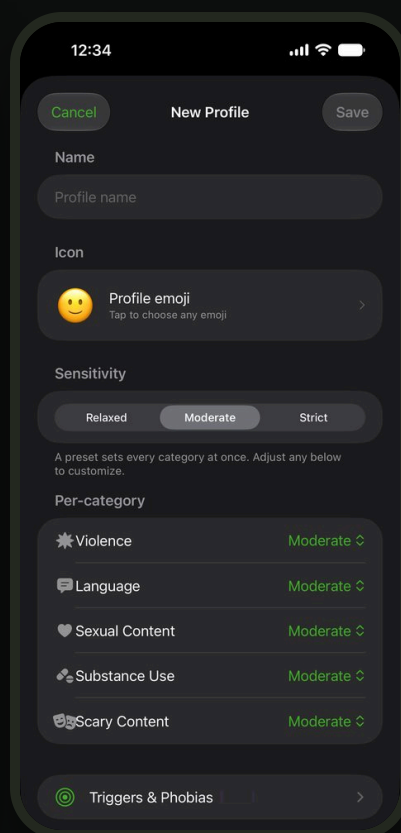
Every movie

Search any film and see its ScoutScore, tier, and every flagged scene at a glance.



Follows your screen

Start the companion and alerts arrive in real time: heads up, rough scene in 30 seconds.



Tuned to your family

Dial each kind of content up or down so the score reflects what matters in your home.

Talking to kids about hard scenes.

The flags tell you what is coming. Here is what to do when it arrives.

Before Name it. "There is a sad part coming, about halfway, and I am right here." A little prediction takes most of the fear out of a scene.

During Stay close and stay calm. A hand on the shoulder says more than pausing does. Your reaction is the one they are watching.

After Ask, do not lecture. "What did you think about that part?" beats "Are you okay?" Open questions let them lead where they need to go.

And It's okay to skip. Skipping a scene is not shielding, it's choosing the right time. You can always come back to it when they are ready.

The words we use.

ScoutScore

A single zero-and-up number for how much flagged content a movie has. Driven by the most intense moments, not the count. (see page 9).

Tier

The color band your score falls in: Tame, Mild, Bold, or Strong.

Heads up

A moment worth being aware of, but not necessarily one to act on.

Mute

A moment intense enough you may want the sound down.

Skip

One of the heaviest moments in the movie. Consider skipping.

Companion

The mode in the app that follows your screen and alerts you before a scene arrives.

Profile

Your family's settings. Dial each kind of content up or down and the score adjusts to you.

Standard cut

The common runtime a guide's timings are based on. Streaming versions can differ slightly.

Talking point

A moment worth pausing on together. In this guide, the blue boxes are conversation starters for after a scene.

Trigger & phobia

A specific fear, like clowns, vomit, spiders, needles, or dogs in peril. Switch one on in the app and any scene that touches it lifts for your family.

Rendition

The original artwork we drew for each film. In the app you get the real movie art.

Watch-along

The scene-by-scene timeline that faces each movie, so the whole film is in front of you as you watch.

YOU JUST DID IT BY HAND

This guide is the map. FilmScout is the GPS.

ON PAPER

A folding map

You watch the clock, flip pages, and hope your streaming version lines up before the scene catches your kid.

IN THE APP

A GPS

It watches the road for you: "heads up, rough scene in 30 seconds." No squinting, no missed exits, on any movie you search.

The twelve movies in this guide are free to scout in the app. The one your kid actually wants this weekend is in there too.
